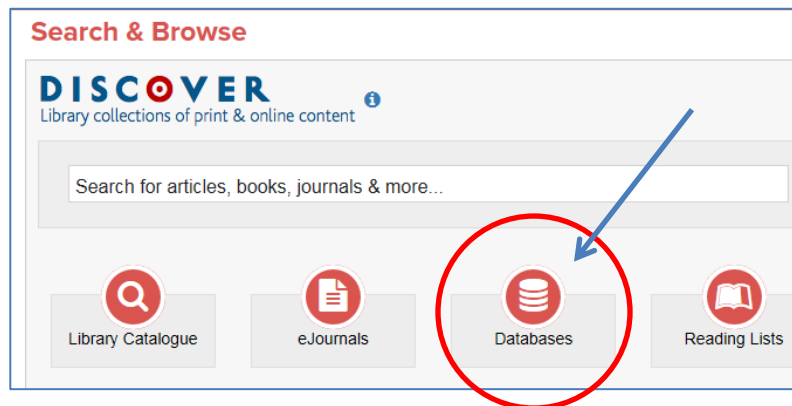
LIBRARY TIP

Did you know that you have access to thousands of scholarly academic works (in **eBooks** format) from the celebrated scholarly list of ***Oxford University Press***?

Try:

Oxford Scholarship Online

Go to University of Liverpool site at <https://libguides.liverpool.ac.uk/library> . Click “**Databases**”. Go to database list under “**O**”, and select “**Oxford Scholarship Online**”.



Log on using the same UoL student username and password that you normally use to access VITAL.

In the search box, search for eBooks using keyword, title, author, ISBN or subject. For example, let's use the keyword "**inchoate liability**".


