THE CUSTOMS LAW, 1990

CUSTOMS (BONDED WAREHOUSE) A.B.C. LIQUOR (GRAND CAYMAN BOTTLERS AND BLENDERS) REGULATIONS, 1997

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Governor in Council by section 73 of the Customs Law, 1990, the Governor in Council makes the following Regulations:

Short title

1. These Regulations may be cited the Customs (Bonded Warehouse) A.B.C. Liquor (Grand Cayman Bottlers and Blenders) Regulations, 1997.

Prescribed warehouse

2. Subject to compliance with the condition specified in Schedule 2, the premises described in Schedule 1 is a bonded warehouse.

Warehouse keeper

3. The person named in Schedule 3 is nominated to be the warehouse keeper of the warehouse referred to in regulation 2.

Repeal

4. The Customs (Prescribed Warehouse) (No. 2) (Amendment) Regulations, 1988 and the Customs (Prescribed Warehouse) (No. 2) (Amendment) Regulations, 1990 are repealed.

SCHEDULE 1

The Bonded Warehouse

That part of the building located on Crewe Road, Block 20E, Parcel 32, Georgetown East consisting of an area of 600 square feet more particularly delineated on the plan attached to the application for approval of a bonded warehouse made by Keith Baldwin on 17 January, 1997.

SCHEDULE 2

Condition

That no goods, other than spirits and beer the property of A.B.C. Liquor (Grand Cayman Bottlers and Blenders), be stored in the bonded warehouse.
