A LAW TO AMEND THE ANIMALS LAW (1996 REVISION)

ENACTED by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

- This Law may be cited as the Animals (Amendment) (Straying and Short title Trespassing) Law, 1997.
- In this Law, unless the context otherwise requires, "the principal Law" Definition means the Animals Law (1996 Revision).
- Section 31 of the principal Law is repealed and the following section is substituted-

Responsibility for trespass by animals

- "31. The owner of any animals, other than honey-bees, shall take proper and effective measures to prevent them from trespassing on land in the occupation or ownership of another, and from straying on to the public highway and, subject to sections 32 and 33, the owner of such animals shall be responsible in damages for any injury or damage caused or done by the animal when so trespassing or straying.".
- Section 34 of the principal Law is repealed and the following section is Penalty for allowing substituted-

animals to cause danger

The Animals (Amendment) (Straying and Trespassing) Law, 1997

"34. A person who, having the possession or ownership of an animal, permits it to stray on to the highway is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$500.".
