The Motor Vehicles (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1965

Short title  
and  
Commencement.

Amendment of  
Regulation 21.

1. In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Administrator in Council by section 31 of the Motor Vehicles Law, 1961 the following Regulations are hereby made –

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1965, and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice published in the Cayman Islands.

3. Regulation 21 of the Motor Vehicle Regulations, 1961 (hereinafter referred to as the principal regulations) are hereby amended by the addition of the following new regulations –

“(3) It shall be lawful for the licensing authority to require any person holding a valid driving licence to undergo a medical examination by a medical examiner under the terms laid out in Form G.

(4) It shall be lawful for the licensing authority to require any person found driving a motor vehicle not in possession of a valid driving licence to undergo a medical examination by a medical examiner under the terms laid out in Form G.

(5) It shall be an offence under these Regulations if any person required to undergo a medical examination shall fail to present himself for such medical examination within five days of receipt of an order in writing.

(6) The Administrator may, upon written application of the licensing authority supported by medical evidence in the form of certificate G, revoke a driving licence or prohibit the re-licensing of a previous holder of a driving licence. In all such cases a copy of the application by the licensing authority and a copy of the relevant Form G shall be sent to the person named not later than the originals are submitted to the Administrator."

4. Regulation 22 of the principal regulations is deleted and replaced as follows — Amendment of  
Regulation 22.

" Fee for test. 22. A fee of one pound shall be paid by an applicant for a test under regulation 20."

5. The principal regulations are hereby amended by the addition of a new regulation immediately following regulation 36 — New Regulation  
36A.

" Unattended      36 A. No person shall leave a  
Motor Vehicle.      motor vehicle unattended  
                                 on a public road with the  
                                 engine running."

6. The principal regulations are hereby amended by the substitution of the word "less" for the word "more" in the last line of regulation 37 (2).
