A LAW to Amend the Liquor Licensing Law, 1955

Law 4 of 1955.

()

Enacted by the Legislature of the Cayman Islands.

1 – This Law may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Law, 1965, and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by Government Notice in the Cayman Islands.

2 – Section 19 of the Liquor Licensing Law, 1955, is hereby deleted and replaced as follows —

2 (No. 31) *The Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Law, 1965.*

"Licensed premises to be closed on Sundays, Christmas Day and Good Friday.

19 - All licensed premises, with the exception of hotels selling intoxicating liquor to a lodger, boarder or day tourist for consumption on the premises and registered clubs selling intoxicating liquor to members or their guests for consumption on the premises, and premises at points of exit from the Islands where liquor is sold duty free to departing travellers, shall be closed on Sundays, Christmas Day and Good Friday."
